EVIDENCE

Shown as 'Camp' on 1st Edition O.S six inch map Sheet 60 surveyed in 1862 , and as 'Homestead' on current 1:10k map. Slight earthworks clearly visible on air photos.

DESCRIPTION

The remains of a farmstead of Romano-British date situated on the top of a hill with commanding views in all directions. The farmstead, sub-rectangular in shape, measures a maximum of 38m north west to south east by 36m north east to south west within a broad ditch 5m wide. Within the ditch there is a bank of earth and stone standing in places to a maximum height of 1.2m above the bottom of the ditch. The ditch is surrounded by a counterscarp bank of stone and earth 3m wide and in places 1m high above the bottom of the ditch. In the south east side of the enclosure there is an entrance, 3m wide, carried across the ditch on a raised causeway; the entrance in the north west side is a later feature. Flanking the entrance in the south east angle there is a sunken yard visible as a large depression 1m deep. [NHLE]
