
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## DESCRIPTION

Burnbank Farmhouse is of no great size but is marked out as being of above-average status by the quality of its fabric and architectural detailing; it would appear to date from the second quarter of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. It is built of squared roughly-tooled stone with raised ashlar quoins and dressings under a Welsh slate roof. It has a two-storey three-bay frontage with a central ashlar porch that has a four-centred doorway in broad chamfered surround, under a recess with a trefoiled Gothic arch, holding a cast-iron coat of arms with the motto 'FIDES FRETUS' (relying on faith'); the side walls each have a small Gothic-arched window. The main windows are four-pane sashes, in alternating-block surrounds under a hollow-chamfered eaves cornice; the end gables have a triangular-section coping and end stacks carried on corbels, that have been lowered, with their original moulded caps being re-set. There is a short and slightly lower wing to the north-east, with an outshot on the west of it; their openings have been altered, and the wing has lost its original end stack, although a pair of corbels for it remain in place. *Peter Ryder, Farm Survey 2006*
