#### **EVIDENCE**

#### DESCRIPTION

The farmhouse, facing south, is of coursed squared stone showing a rough diagonal tooling with alternating smooth-faced quoins, and a Welsh slate roof. The central doorway, partly concealed by the 20<sup>th</sup> century glazed porch has a square head under a blind round arch, with a raised oval panel inscribed J.T. 1845 inside a pattered border; the door is recent but the five –pane overlight older. On either side are canted ashlar bays of late-19<sup>th</sup> century date, with stop-chamfered surrounds and a big hollow moulded cornice. The upper windows are four-pane sashes in square-edged alternating-block surrounds; the roof has end stacks. The back of the house has an outshut covering its central section; the way in which the stair window (which has margined glazing of late-19<sup>th</sup> century type) cuts into the roof shows that there have been internal alterations.
