Former station on the Border Counties Railway. Opened to traffic on 1 February 1961. No building is shown here on the 1<sup>st</sup> Edition of OS '6 inch' Map Northumberland Old Series Sheet 67 Surveyed 1861-1862 (cf. Thorneyburn and Charlton Stations) but the entry in the Tarset & Greystead Jubilee Book states that the station was built in 1888. A single story stone with slate gable roof building which incorporated the station offices facing the single platform and the stationmaster's house in a wing at right angles to the south.


