
## EVIDENCE

# DESCRIPTION

The remains of a bastle stand amongst the buildings of Donkleywood Farm on the north side of the road through the hamlet [C199]. The building has apparently been 12.3m long by 7.55m wide with walls of large, roughly squared blocks, 1.55-1.70m thick. The east end stands to a height of 2.9m with a modern building built against its external face. Internally there is a 0.20m setback 1.9m [?] above the present ground level. Only a few metres of the side walls survive: the northern disappears beneath a later farm building whilst the southern runs beneath the roadside grass verge where its footing are just visible [but not now] The short length of wall linking the stub of the south wall with the corner of the later building is a recent construction, re-using old stones, put up when a National Park team cleared the interior of the bastle of rubbish and rubble a few years ago.
