C18th. rendered house, the stable roughly coursed stone. Welsh and Lakeland slate roof. Brick chimneys. house and stable under one roof, though as the stable has kneelers and the house does not they may have been built at different times. Both, however are C18th. The group is mainly notable for the attractive roof and C18th kneelers. The stable has C18th collar beam trusses. To the left a good unaltered group of two-storey early C19th farm buildings and a single storey two-bay cart shed. [Grundy 1987]
