EVIDENCE

Extant. Shown on 1st Edition of OS '1:2500 Northumberland Old Series' Sheet 59.15, Surveyed 1862. By the 2nd Edition, surveyed 1896, it has been rebuilt on a new site. (see below)

DESCRIPTION

The 1862 OS plan shows a rectangular building, approx 24m long and 5-6m deep, wider at the SW end. Probably a 'long house' with the dwelling and farm building(s) under one roof, cf. Rushend (A0365). Like Rushend, and several former cottages to the East of Ryeclose, it was adjacent to the former head dyke (A0202) which separated cultivated land from Thorneyburn Common, prior to Parliamentary Enclosure. By 1896 the footprint of the building is U-shaped, the length of the frontage facing SE is still c.24m long but there are now two wings or outshots at the back. This new building is c.30m NE of the original.
