DESCRIPTION

A detached 1 ½ storey three-bay house. A boarded door and four pane sash windows, those on the first floor in dormers. [since renewed]. The roof is gabled with stone, corniced end stacks. The west gable covered with slates or tiles after removal of a small shelter belt. To the right a single storey stable with boarded doors and a 6-pane window, attached to a 2-storey byre and granary with a door(s) to the rear. At the right end, a poultingery, a pig sty on the ground floor (to deter foxes) and a hen house above. [After Grundy 1987]

Peter Ryder has reported that the range of outbuildings contains the remains of a bastle 7.7 x 6.6m with wall between 0.8m and 1.05m thick. see also A0240.
