EVIDENCE

Extant, fragmentary remains.

DESCRIPTION

The slight remains of a bastle, recently 'rediscovered' lie to the SE of a 19th-century cottage. The building has apparently been 7m wide by c.15m long. The lower part of the SE end wall, of the usual massive rubble and 1.6m thick, is incorporated into a later field boundary; its only feature is a central slit vent. The rest of the bastle shows only as a vegetated mound; a trial trench by Brian Long (late 1980s) uncovered the footings of the NW end wall, 2.0m thick; there was a drain running under the wall but no sign of the central byre doorway one might have expected.
