# DESCRIPTION

A two-storey, three-bay house. Well-dressed stone with raised alternating quoins. Lakeland slate roof. There is a panelled door with an overlight in a raised alternating block surround with a triple keystone – an unusually architectural treatment for a Northumbrian farmhouse. The centre stone of the keystone has an incised heart. renewed 16-pane sash windows. Gabled roof with C20 brick chimneys; a fine roof over the continuous outshut to the rear. The small U-plan of farm buildings are later than the house – the windows have stop-chamfered surrounds of typical mid-C19 type. They have been too much altered to be of special interest.
