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DESCRIPTION

Built 1836 and late c19th. Quite a large house with a facade in two sections. Ashlar with Welsh slate roof. To the right the original 3-bay farmhouse - its central doorway turned into a window; it has a date panel of 1836 on the lintel. The windows are late C19th sixteen pane sashes and this section is three storeys high with the top storey being dormer windows.

To the left a large late c19th addition with canted corners and a hipped roof. There is a corniced porch and irregularly-placed two-light mullioned windows with 16 paned sashes in each light.

Inside the house are several excellent mid-C18th doorcases with enriched mouldings, elaborate pulvinated friezes and cornices, also two equally fine but slightly later fireplaces. These were all brought from Felton Hall.
